

Funny Quilting Story.

Let me tell you about my cat, Sobek. Sobek is a Tuxedo cat and he believes that he should be the center of everyone's attention REGARDLESS of what they are doing. He just loves to be loved. He's definitely used up some of his lives because a more curious cat I have never seen. You know that when it comes to quilting, Sobek has to be in the middle of every part of the operation. He plays with my fabric as I am folding it after prewashing. He jumps on the ironing board to make sure I'm getting all of the wrinkles out as I iron. He sits in my lap and checks to make sure that all of my stitches are even and that the thread isn't tangled when I am hand sewing. He even checks to make sure that the quilt is going to be snugly and warm while I am putting on the binding. But above and beyond all things he loves the sewing machine needle and the rotary cutter. He thinks that he should check both for sharpness while I am using them. He does this by putting his paw in front of the cutter as I am cutting and under the needle as it moves up and down otherwise known as "playing chicken.". Luckily we haven't had any disasters yet! Sobek was never so much help as the day I started to make the quilt *Focus Pocus* by the Swirly Girls. The way the pattern works is that each large block has a smaller piece of fabric that connects to it on all four sides. The quilt has to be fully laid

out to be assembled. At the time, I didn't have a design wall and I was sewing at my dining room table. I simply moved the table to one end of the room and laid the quilt out on the floor, not thinking at all about my little helper. I started carefully sewing my blocks together while Sobek figured out how he could "help." In his opinion, the best way to help was to go to the top of the stairs, run all the way down and slide across my quilt pieces, messing them all up. He did this over and over and over again. He's an indoor cat so I couldn't just put him outside and my dining room has no doors. I tried covering the quilt with a sheet – no joy, that just made it more fun. I tried laying out just one row at a time and I made too many mistakes. I tried locking him in the basement and the caterwauling was enough to break eardrums. Finally, I just had to grin and bear it. Sobek continued to run down the stairs and slide for as long as I had that quilt laid out on the floor. He never tired of the game and I have never laid a quilt out on the floor again!!

Prince William County Fair

Would you believe that it is time to think about the Prince William County Fair for 2016! Daffodil Quilts is collecting quilts to enter in the fair. Here is how it works. Please bring your clean, lint and pet hair free quilts to the August 8th Guild meeting. Jane will have the registration forms all ready for you fill out (along with help understanding the form). Then on August 11th, she will take all of the quilts to the fairgrounds and get them registered for the fair. You come back to Daffodil Quilts on or after August 22nd to pick your quilt, ribbons and cash winnings! There are lots of new quilt categories this year so everybody ought to be able to find someplace to put in a quilt. Last year Jane took 87 quilts to the fair. This year I would like to blow that number out of the water!

Technically, your quilt should have been completed in the last year, however if it has never been shown at the Prince William County Fair then it is OK to enter it.

The judging is divided into two categories – age 20-59 and age 60+

Here are the categories:

- Baby quilt
- Hand Appliqued Quilt
- Machine Appliqued Quilt
- Hand Quilted
- Long Arm Quilted, computer Assisted
- Long Arm Quilted, Pantograph
- Long Arm Quilted, Free Motion
- Machine Quilt, free motion, other than long arm
- Machine quilt, other method
- Lap quilting, must measure under 48" square
- Hand pieced quilt
- Machine Pieced Quilt

Best in Show is awarded in both age categories for quilts under 60" x 60" and over 60" by 60".

I know many people are often concerned about getting their quilts back soiled or having them lost. I can assure you that the Fair staff makes every effort to ensure the proper care of your precious quilts and I stay during the registration process to insure that each and every quilt that I take in is properly marked.

Quilts to **not** require a hanging sleeve for the fair and if you have a label on your quilt please cover it with masking tape for the judging process.

Community Service Quilts

The guild has been donating Community Service Quilts to the following charities for over 15 years:

- **Walter Reed National Military Medical Center** (Quilt sizes: 50" x 60" and 72" x 90") - Walter Reed is one of the nation's largest and most renowned military medical centers. WRNMMC serves military families and our nation's active duty, returning war heroes, veterans and our Nation's leaders. Donated quilts are given to servicemen/women who have been injured in combat. Smaller quilts are provided to servicemen/women or used as gifts for the patients to purchase for their loved ones.
- **CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates)** (Any size quilt) – These quilts are made from colorful fabrics and are presented to children for comfort allowing them to have something to call their own. The remainder are distributed to children who have been adopted within the last year at the November National Adoption Day Ceremony at the Prince William Court House in Manassas, Virginia.
- **Manassas and Gainesville Health and Rehabilitation Centers** (Quilt sizes: 36" x 39") – Provides comprehensive rehabilitation, long-term and respite care services, including physical, occupational

and speech therapy, audiology, cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation. Laps quilts are provided to patients for use due to their rehabilitation stays or used as prizes for Bingo, etc.

BOUTIQUE CHAIRPERSON

The Boutique Chairperson is responsible for overseeing the activities of the SHQG Boutique. Because of the nature of the boutique, it is a yearlong process of workshops, handing out patterns and collecting donated items. The objective is to have new, fresh ideas and items to sell at a reasonable cost. The Chairperson should recruit a couple of people to assist her.

Activities include:

- setting up workshops to make a variety of handmade items
- collect finished items from workshops and individuals
- schedule a "Pricing Party" approximately two weeks before the show to price the items for sale
- take completed items to the show and set-up the boutique booth by arranging merchandise, tables, racks, etc.
- breakdown the boutique at the end of the show and store/pass along any leftover items to the next Boutique Chairperson.

For the challenge for 2017 you must pick a color and use only that color and black and/or white – no gray... unless that is the color you choose. However – you are not limited to a single

color in the palette. You may use all shades, tints and variations of your color. For example – if you choose green you can mix everything from pale green to olive to Kelly to hunter. If you go for red, you can use everything from pastel pink to harlot scarlet. You can use solids, tone on tone prints or prints with black and white. You may NOT use any print that contains colors other than your chosen one. For example, if blue is your color, you can use batiks in all shades of blue, but NOT if there are spots of purple. Embellishments are fine, but must also be in your color palette.
