# 2024 Raffle Quilt

Training can take up to a year or more and can cost over \$20,000 per dog. The organization depends on donations and grants.

# **Community Service**

#### **Warrior Retreat Center, Haymarket**

Quilts of Honor have slightly different requirements, here are the specifics:

Quilt needs to be a minimum size of 50" x 60" or maximum 60" x 70"

Quilt is to be red, white, and blue with no juvenile prints.

Please do not use any branch specific fabric, such as Army, Navy, Marine Corp. etc.

Quilts are to be quilted and not tied.

Quilt needs to be labeled with "Stone House Quilters" and the date. I have labels and the guild stamp if you do not want to make your own. However, you may include the name of the people who worked on the quilt.

<u>Pillowcases</u>: Continued need for pillowcases for the servicewomen, wives of the servicemen and the mothers of the servicemen and women.

Can be any fabric choice

Below is a link that has an excellent tutorial on how to do the "Burrito Method" of making pillow-cases. This method is very quick and easy with all enclosed seams and is sewn on a regular sewing machine-no serger needed!

#### **CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates)**

Quilts made from colorful fabrics and can be any size. They are presented to children for comfort allowing them to have something to call their own.

Please consider all ages when making these quilts. The need for older children is always more than baby quilts. But both are greatly appreciated! Consider making a matching pillowcase to wrap the quilt in!

Quilt sizes suggestion 36" x 39" (lap size for a use in a wheelchair)

# Virginia Quilt Museum

#### Candid/Creative: Textile Portraits by Sandy Curran-Now through June 27

This exhibition features the quilts of Newport News artist Sandy Curran to highlight her development throughout the years. Her work examines human emotions – a way to exorcise the fears and frustrations as well as love and joy within our lives.

#### Quilters' Save Our Stories – An Exhibit in Coordination with the Quilt Alliance— Now through June 15

Started in 1999 by the Quilt Alliance, Quilters' Save Our Stories (QSOS) is the largest oral history collection about quiltmakers in the world. This exhibit features a collection of quilts made by some of the Virginians who have participated in QSOS.

#### VQM Applique Show—Now through May 11

This exhibit will highlight the use of applique in a variety of quilts throughout history. The French word applique means applied. Applique motifs are cut from one or more fabrics and are laid on top of a larger background fabric. They grew in popularity in Virginia due to the warmer climate and less of a need for bedcovers. However, overtime, they became the "elegant" quilts, which took extra care and time to make.

#### Code Switch by Andi Cullins—Now through June 15

Andi Cullins is the product of a biracial marriage, raised in the 1950's and early 60's. Growing up, Andi had to navigate living in the intersection of clashing cultures; Black and White, poor and privileged, corporate business and single motherhood. This exhibit features the use of African and other ethnic fabrics, mixed with western fabric to show the inter-relationship of the mainstream and marginalized cultures - each referential to the other.

# **Library Quilts**

Thank you to all who have been loaning quilts for our display at the Manassas Central Library. The librarians tell me how much they, and library patrons, enjoy the display every day.

We are already moving into 2025 with pledges from you and I appreciate your continued support.

As a reminder and for those who haven't yet signed up, your quilt should be no larger than 45" x 45" as the panel onto which the quilts are mounted is only about 50" wide. Below the quilt is lettering the library provided that identifies the quilt as being on display. . . "Courtesy of Stone House Quilters". So, we don't want the length of the quilt to cover this sign.

Once you sign up, I will send you an e-mail about 1-2 months prior to your month as a reminder so you have enough time to either pull the quilt from your collection, or finish one you are working on. You can give me the quilt at the monthly meeting or drop it off at Friday morning BEE. Or, we can make other arrangements to get together. Your quilt will be returned at the end of the month when I swap it out for the next one.

# STONE HOUSE QUILTER'S GUILD NAME TAG

FABRICS NEEDED: Green for grass

Brick for house and chimney's

Blue for sky

Colors for doors & windows – your choice

Cut 1 - 4 1/2" by 1 1/4" strip for *grass* 

Cut 1 - 4 ½" by 2" strip for base of house

Cut 1 - 4 1/2" wide by 1 1/2" long strip for roof

Cut 1 - 1 ½" by 1 ½" block and cut in half for sky on either side of the roof

Cut 3 - 1 1/2" by 1 1/4" blocks for sky on both sides of chimneys

Cut 2 - 1" by 1 1/4" blocks for chimneys

Cut 1 - 1" by 3/4" strip for door

Cut  $4 - \frac{1}{2}$ " by  $\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks for **windows** 

#### Instructions: for pieced pattern

- 1. Sew together the *grass* and *base of the house* fabric.
- 2. Sew together *roof* and the 2 pieces for the *sky on either side of the roof*, then sew that piece to the *grass* and *base of the house* (from step 1).
- 3. Sew together the strips of **sky on both sides of chimneys** and then sew it to the rest of the house (step 2).
- 4. Take the **door** piece and fuse it to the front of the house.
- 5. Take the *windows* and fuse those to the front of the house on either side of the door.
- 6. The Name Tag finishes at 4" x 4". You may make it larger if you like.

#### Instructions: for paper pieced pattern

- 1. Have scrap pieces of fabrics in the colors listed above
- 2. Cut out the paper pieces and follow the numbers sewing in the order listed on the pattern.
  - A. Sew piece 1 and 2 then fuse the doors and windows to the base of the house.
  - B. Sew *roof* and *sky* pieces in order listed on the pattern
  - C. Sew sky on both sides of chimneys and chimneys in order listed on pattern
- 3. Sew pieces A, B & C together.

Make sure your name can be printed somewhere on the label and you may embellish and finish your name tag any way you like.
